Conference Calendar, 2016 Smarter Balanced Assessment (SBA) Data 2016 Smarter Balanced Assessment (SBA) Data Presented by Superintendent, Dr. Kawaguchi and Mrs. Harris, Assistant Superintendent Instructional Services.

Dr. Kawaguchi opened the presentation by stating her excitement in the overall growth within the District. She noted that the students in the district are working harder, thinking more critically and applying their learning skills to the real world as evidence by the SBA 2016 results.

- SBA is an online assessment with two components:
 - 1. CAT Compute Adaptive Test
 - 2. PT Performance Task

ELA

Across the district, key areas to target under ELA include:

- Reading
- Listening
- *Overall within the District, ELA scores were higher than Math scores.

MATH

Grades 4 and 5 - Math scores higher than previous year.

It was noted that the 2016 5th Grade Science Scores have not been released by the State and that the state is preparing to transition from CA Standards Test for Science to the Next Generation Science Standards (NGSS) assessments. NGSS pilot will begin during the 2016-17 school year.

Physical Fitness Assessments: Official scores available late October 2016.

In closing, it was noted that the District and Site Administrators are working with staff to identify areas of strength and areas in which to grow. Goals to improve instruction will be identified in both ELA and Math. The District will continue to provide development for administrators and teachers and focus on improving student mastery at all grade level standards.
