Dr. Kawaguchi stated to the Board of Trustees that Resolution R-22-71 authorizes the Bonds to be issued as taxable general obligation bonds pursuant to the authority contained in the California Government Code (starting at Section 53506), which will be payable from the receipts of ad valorem property taxes levied by the County on property within the District, in order to prepay the District's 2010 Refunding Certificates of Participation. Resolution R-22-71 also authorizes designated officers of the District to bring into final form and execute the Official Statement, Bond Purchase Agreement and Continuing Disclosure Certificate. Dr. Kawaguchi introduced Mr. Khushroo Gheyara, District Financial Advisor and Executive Vice President of Caldwell Flores Winters, Inc., to share additional information about Resolution R-22-71. The motion was made by Mr. Chase, seconded by Mrs. Jelllings, and passed 5-0 by a voice vote, to approve Resolution R-22-71 of the Board of Trustees of the Sulphur Springs Union School District Authorizing the Issuance and Sale of Taxable General Obligation Bonds, Election of 2012, Series 2022F, in an Aggregate Principal Amount Not to Exceed \$13,466,913.75 and Approving Related Documents and Actions.
